BARCELONA, also has been called the "Paris of Spain". The city is a major cultural center with a fascinating history. Everywhere there are archives, libraries, museums and buildings of interest plus superb examples of modernist and Art Nouveau décor and architecture, including the Picasso Gallery. Stroll along Las Ramblas, a wonderfully vibrant part of the city where street vendors and performers vie for your attention. Visit Gaudi's unfinished Sagrada Familia, a true architectural masterpiece.

FUNCHAL (MADERIA), PORTUGAL is an enchanting island. Explore its hidden valleys, peaks and botanical gardens. Maderia lace and Maderia wine are both still produced here in the Old World tradition. Take a scenic drive along the coves and bays of its coastline and past the colorful fishing village of Camara de Lobos.

LA PALMA, SANTA CRUZ CANARY ISLANDS is one of the seven islands in the Canary Islands archipelago off the coast of Africa and is dominated by natural beauty, from bright blue skies to black sand beaches. Santa Cruz is known for balconies which range in size, color and material, from canary pine to antique iron.

TENERIFE, CANARY ISLANDS is the largest of the Canary Islands. The landscape offers mountains, lush valleys, a gigantic crater and fabulous beaches. Not to be missed is its mysterious pyramids and the colonial city of Puerto de la Cruz.

LANZAROTE, CANARY ISLANDS has over 300 volcanoes and perfect weather year around. Besides being an ecological paradise, Lanzarote offers exciting and different sightseeing. Check out El Golfo, a volcanic crater filled by underground seawater. It is a spectacular site. Visit the Cesar Manrique Foundation to admire works by this world famous artist as well as his private collection of other artists.

CASABLANCA, MOROCCO is the largest city in Morocco and North Africa's busiest port, but its winding alley ways reveal the romance immortalized on film by Bogart and Bergman. Markets and Moorish masterpieces abound, and the Hassan II Mosque, site of the world's tallest minaret, proves that big is indeed beautiful. Boulevard Muhammad V is Casablanca's busiest shopping street and it is along this boulevard where you will find a charming combination of European and Oriental architectural styles. For some of the greatest shopping and a taste of local favorites, nowhere beats the souks, or the Medina, where you will be able to find the most traditional of arts and crafts.

LISBON, PORTUGAL offers unparalleled sites to visit. Explore Sintra, considered to be one of the most beautiful palaces in Portugal, once the summer residence of Portuguese kings and aristocrats. A visit to this capital city is not complete without a walk from Rossio Square to the main thoroughfare, the Avenida da Liberdade. Visit Mosterio dos Jeronimos, commissioned in 1501 after Vasco da Gama's return from his voyage, this remarkable monastery is a beautiful and unique example of Manueline architecture.

SEVILLE (CADIZ), SPAIN is the artistic, cultural, and financial of southern Spain. The city's cathedral, built on the former site of the city's mosque, is amongst the largest of all medieval and Gothic cathedrals and is lavishly decorated with a large quantity of gold. The cathedral is topped with a statue, known locally as El Giralddillo, representing Faith. The Alcazar facing the cathedral has developed from the city's old Moorish Palace, mainly in the Mudejar style. Its gardens are a blend of Moorish, Andalusian, and Christian traditions. Also of interest is Torre del Oro, the Town Hall and the University of Sevilla housed in the original site of the first tobacco factory in Europe.

MALAGA, SPAIN a bustling coastal city and the capital of the Costa del Sol. Malaga is the second largest port in Spain. One of its most interesting places is to explore the old historic quarter which dates back nearly 800 years. Malaga is a gateway to Granada's Alhambra Palace, one of Spain's greatest architectural accomplishments. Or you may wish to visit Nerja, one of the most beautiful white washed towns of Spain.
